About the Founder — Pam's Story

On July 29, 2005, I was diagnosed with Burkitts Lymphoma, a rare form of Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma (NHL). I had just turned 40. I started chemotherapy treatments on August 5, 2005, after a mishap in the hospital, where they punctured my lung. The treatments were administered in the hospital, where I endured 36 – 54 hours of chemo each round.

My blood counts began to dip rather quickly. I was quarantined in the hospital, as well as at home under the watchful care of my husband, Derrick.

I started to need blood and platelet transfusions, and in September, there was a Blood Drive at my family's restaurant, Southport Raw Bar. My new motto became "Be Positive" since that is my blood type. There was a good turnout, where my family

and friends not only helped me, but also saved the lives of others by donating their blood.

In October, I went to MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas and found out that the tumor was gone. This is when my doctors decided that I would only have six chemo treatments instead of eight, like originally planned.

I was always talking to people in the hospital and always had a positive attitude. My last treatment was in December 2005, and for Christmas, my husband, Derrick started this foundation. The intention is so that I can help other people dealing with cancer.

I am considered in remission now, but plan on being a cancer survivor.

The support system is a very important aspect of a patients recovery. In order to keep a "normal" lifestyle, the Foundation, in association with Dream Dinners, will deliver food to the families as needed. These are fresh meals that are prepared in Dream Dinners kitchen by our volunteers and then delivered to the home. They should be frozen upon arrival and they will last up to 60 days. Parents will not have to worry about not having to go to the grocery store or eating fast food if time is short.
